Emergency Preparedness Week 2024

Kings County, NS – May 5 – 11, 2024 is recognized in Kings County as **Emergency Preparedness Week (EP Week)**. This is an annual event that takes place each year during the first full week of May, and this year's theme is "*Be Prepared. Know Your Risks*."

While being prepared for disruption is important year-round, EP Week provides a unique opportunity to spotlight emergency preparedness. Between May 5th and 11th join the campaign to encourage your community members to take actions to reduce their risk. Working together with community leaders, first responders, non-government organizations and all levels of government, we can build a more resilient and safer Kings County.



To celebrate **Emergency Preparedness Week**, the Kings Regional Emergency Management Organization (Kings REMO) encourages everyone to understand the risks in their area and learn what actions they can take to protect themselves and their families.

Step 1: Know the Risks

Being aware of the potential risks we face in Nova Scotia can help you to be better prepared should an emergency occur. You may find it helpful to make a list of these risks and think about how they might affect you and your family. Knowing the risks in your community or region can help you to be better prepared when an emergency occurs.

Step 2: Make a Plan

In an emergency, your family may not be together, or you may be asked to evacuate your home. Thinking about what you would do in different situations and preparing a plan with every member of your family is the first step to being prepared.

Step 3: Get a Kit

Your emergency survival kit should have everything you and your family would need to be safe and take care of yourselves for at least three days (72 hours) immediately following an emergency.
