

Step 1: Know the Risks





Know your Region

 The consequences of emergencies can be similar, but knowing the risks in your region can help you better prepare





Step 2: Make a Plan





You aren't prepared until you make a Plan

- Use your 'Emergency Preparedness Guide' as an outline (www.getprepared.gc.ca)
- Photocopy your Plan
- Keep copies of your plan in a safe and memorable place




Step 2: Make a Plan





Your Family Plan

- Emergency Exits
- Designate a Family Meeting Area
- Escape Routes from neighbourhood



• Ensure help for people with special needs

Step 2: Make a Plan





Other Helpful Hints:

- Choose an out-of-town contact person
- Make arrangements through friends or community centres
- Practice your Plan!
- Review your Plan annually







To prepare for an emergency that could last 72 hours or more, what would you put in a kit?











Prepare at least two kits

One for home

Minimum of 3 days (72 hours)







Prepare at least two kits

One for home, and



....One for each member of your family "Emergency Go-Bag"







Special Items to Consider:

- Medications
- Eyeglasses
- Food for pets
- Games & Toys for children
- Diapers & Formula







Don't forget Copies of Important Documents – for example:

- List of important numbers
- Home Insurance Papers
- Vehicle titles, leases, loan documents
- Passports
- Social Insurance cards
- Birth Certificates
- List of medications Doctors phone numbers
- Home Inventory List


